WHAT IS SOUND GENERATOR?

Now in its fourth year, **Sound Generator** is a **research and development** (R & D) programme that supports artists and seeds the development of an ambitious new project.

Each year six early career music and sound artists spend six months developing and testing their project, supported by mentoring from a range of experts.

By the end of the programme artists will have thoroughly explored their initial idea and tested that they can make it work, ready for the next stage of full commissioning and public engagement.

During the process artists will be able to try out new approaches, learn from others, increase their network and develop their practice.

Projects can be:

- For indoors or outdoors
- Suitable for venue touring or site specific
- Digital, installation or live
- Music, sound or multi-disciplinary
- Designed to reach a new audience, work with a specific community or respond to the world we live in.

Following an open call, six artists will each receive an award of £2500 to research and develop their idea across six months (October 2024 to March 2025).

In addition to £2500, the programme includes access to the Sound Generator Network with support sessions from a range of exceptional mentors, plus opportunities to connect with other artists on the programme.

The R & D will culminate in the creation of a short audio or video sample of the project, and a project outline / proposal for its delivery. These will be presented by each artist at an internal sharing at the end of the programme and sent out to a wide network of industry contacts.

WHO IS IT FOR?

- UK* creators that reflect the population of the UK
- Creators with **5 – 10 years professional experience**
- Creators who want to develop a new idea that extends their practice, with a public outcome in mind.
- Artists pushing the boundaries of music. Working within, but not exclusively, jazz, sound, folk, contemporary classical and electronic music, plus all points in between.

*we define a UK artist as someone who has been based and working in the UK for more than 5 years.

WHAT ARE WE LOOKING TO SUPPORT?

We're looking to support the research and development of artists and ideas:

- that demonstrate ambition and quality
- in a range of formats including live, digital, installation (**excluding album recordings**)
- that extend artistic practice and discipline (e.g. extending your craft/genre, using new tech, interdisciplinary work)
- suitable for a variety of settings and locations, arts and non-arts
- address public engagement or participation
- that seek to reach a diverse audience or focus on reaching a particular target audience e.g. young people
- that might impact the way we think or feel e.g. about the environment, social issues, or our own / others wellbeing

We are NOT looking to support:

- Projects that already exist
- Album recordings
- Artists with more than 10 years' professional experience

HOW DOES IT WORK?

1. **INITIAL MEETING:** One-to-one consultation with Sound UK producers to clarify your idea and R&D needs. Together we will design how best to use the award and identify mentors.
2. **MONTHLY CATCH UPS:** Phone or video call with your designated Sound UK producer (Maija Handover or Polly Eldridge) to check in on how you're doing.
3. **ARTIST MEET UPS:** three Sound Generator meet ups with guest speakers e.g. funders or artists. These will be online and in person. They are an opportunity to get to know the other Sound Generator artists, share ideas and learn from each other as well as the guest speaker.
4. **MENTORING:** 10 hours' support and advice from up to five mentors to help you develop and test your idea. These include:
 - high level creative, technical, communication and funding professionals
 - programme directors from a range of partners (e.g. venues, heritage organisations and public spaces).

You may want to use that time with just one mentor or across a number of different mentors. The consultation with Sound UK will help decide what will work best for you.

5. **INTERNAL SHARING EVENT & PROJECT DISTRIBUTION:** At the end of the programme, all Sound Generators come together to present their project sample to each other in an internal sharing event. With advice from Sound UK producers, artists create a project outline document which is sent out to Sound UK's network at the end of the programme.

HOW CAN AWARDS BE SPENT?

Sound UK will help each artist decide how best to spend their £2500 award across the 6-month programme.

The award will need to cover your time and any costs to create your idea proposal and audio or visual sample. For example, you might want to buy some software, book a recording or rehearsal studio, employ a wider creative team to try out work in progress or go on site visits.

We anticipate the majority of the award will go towards your time on the project.

PROGRAMME COMMITMENTS

Each artist will spend their award in different ways but we hope the majority will be spent on your time. For example, if 100% of the award was spent on your time this would be 10 days at £250 per day.

In addition, to benefit from this programme it is important to be able to commit to:

- Monthly one to ones with Sound UK – these are for you so can be as short as 15-30 minutes or up to an hour.
- Cohort meetings – We aim to have three meetings, one near the start, half way through and the internal sharing at the end.

We aim for one meeting and the internal sharing to be in person. We always strive to find a geographically suitable location but artists should allow for travel time.

The online meeting is 90 minutes. The first in person meeting is two hours and the internal sharing is an afternoon into early evening.

- Deadlines – meeting the deadline for delivering a project outline, sample and a draft budget on 20 March 2025 is a compulsory requirement of the programme.

OUTCOME & OUTPUTS

Our aim is that each artist will leave the programme with a robust, tested idea ready to be pitched to potential partners and funders to be fully realised.

At the end of 6 months we hope each artist will have developed their creative practice, confidence, skills and contacts.

By the end of the programme each of Sound Generator 24 artist will have created:

- A short project sample (audio / video / visual as appropriate)
- A project outline (word / pdf)

These will be presented at the end of programme internal sharing.

The 2024 programme's project outlines will also be mailed to Sound UK's mailing list of promoters, funders and organisations.

All artists will be advised on potential partners to realise their projects after the programme as appropriate.

HOW DECISIONS WILL BE MADE

Sound UK producers present a long list to a panel of leading industry figures including a funder, an artist and a venue.

Proposals will be considered against the following criteria:

Eligibility

- Artistic vision and quality
- Track record of creator for creating and delivering original material
- Will a public execution of it be feasible
- Has the audience for the project been considered, and how they will engage / participate

We seek to balance:

- Diversity of creators
- Diversity of music and creative styles
- Geography of creators across the country

ACCESS

We are committed to making Sound Generator accessible to all and supporting applicants facing barriers to applying.
